VOTE YES ON SB1270

On June 30, 2021 Arizona Governor Doug Ducey signed the state budget for Fiscal Year 2022, that included a one-time \$5 million appropriation to fund the State Parks Heritage Fund. The monies are allocated as follows:

- 50% local, regional, and state parks
- 30% historic preservation projects
 - 10% non-motorized trails,
 - 10% environmental education

Senator T.J. Shope has introduced SB1270 *state parks; lottery; heritage fund* to restore the ASP Heritage Fund back into the lottery.
