



Our Mission and Goals


Mission: To preserve and enhance Arizona's historic, cultural, and natural heritage

Goals:

Arizona Heritage Fund 1990-2010



1990: Fund created by voter initiative to protect and promote Arizona's natural, cultural, and historic resources


1990 to 2009: Up to \$20 million in annual lottery revenue was divided between Arizona Game and Fish and Arizona State Parks

1991 to 2010: Over \$86,707,396 in awarded State Parks Heritage Fund grants resulted in a total of \$206,703,579 in statewide projects


2010: Legislation swept the State Parks Heritage Fund and eliminated it from statute to balance the budget. Game and Fish Heritage Fund was not impacted and continued to receive \$10 million in annual lottery funds to protect endangered species, acquire habitat for the benefit of sensitive species, provide access to outdoor recreational opportunities, and educate the public about wildlife.

AZ Heritage Fund Grant Project Totals by County

Combined total of Heritage Fund Grant awards and matching funds since 1991 by county. Grants include Local, Regional and State Parks Grants (LRSP), Historic Preservation Grants (HP) & Trails Grants. All of these programs were administered by Arizona State Parks.



Samples of Past Projects Funded by Arizona State Parks Heritage Fund 1990-2010



Town of Gilbert Grant \$316,631 Total Project - \$660,000 (2005)

The Town in partnership with the Gilbert Water Tower Preservation Coalition requested a grant to develop a park at the base of the Gilbert Water Tower in Gilbert's Heritage District. The proposal involved landscaping, lighting, low-level water features, and patio areas.



Arizona State Parks Heritage Fund 2010 - 2019



2010 – 2018: Each year our legislative champions introduced a bill to restore the State Parks Heritage Fund, but it never made it to the Governor's desk. We also considered another citizens initiative, but that proved to be too expensive

THEN in 2019: Two separate bills HB2701, sponsored by Rep. Osborne, and SB1241, sponsored by Senator Brophy McGee, were introduced with bipartisan support. SB1241 passed thus restoring the State Parks Heritage Fund to be funded by grants, donations, and appropriations. On June 7, 2019, SB1241 was signed into statute by Governor Ducey.



Revised Statute 1241; restores State Parks Heritage Fund



Parks: 50% on local, regional, and state parks for outdoor recreation and open space development, restoration, or renovation

Historic Preservation: 30% on local, regional, and state historic preservation projects

Trails: 10% on local, regional, and state non-motorized trails

Education: 10% on outdoor and environmental education

Recognition For Our Efforts 2019





Arizona Forward's Environmental 2019 Excellence Awards

The Alliance received the **"2019 Award of Distinction in the Healthy Communities: Parks & Trails Division"** for restoring the State Parks Heritage Fund





Arizona League of Cities and Town passed a Resolution to support appropriations for the Heritage Fund.

County Supervisors Association adopted 2020 Financial Priorities supporting appropriations for the Heritage Fund.

Over 45 City Mayors and County Supervisors signed-onto a letter expressing their support for the Heritage Fund.

Received the 2020 Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Award for restoring the State Parks Heritage Fund. The award is presented to individuals, organizations, and projects that represent outstanding achievements in preserving Arizona's historic and prehistoric cultural resources by the State Office of Historic Preservation and the Arizona Preservation Foundation.

Arizona State Parks Heritage Fund 2020



Senator Brophy McGee introduced SB1350. This would put the \$10M State Parks Heritage Fund back into the Lottery beneficiary "waterfall" perpetually.

- ✓ Heard in Senate Appropriations. Gowan amended from \$10M to \$1M; passed 8-1
- March 2: Senate Rules
- ✓ Then COVID-19 struck...

Rep. Osborne introduces *HB2551*. This was a one-time appropriation of \$10M.

- January 30: Passed House Land & Agriculture unanimously
- ✓ **February 19:** Passed House Appropriations 9-1
- ✓ February 25: House Rules
- ✓ House passed 54-6
- ✓ Then COVID-19 struck...

Arizona State Parks Heritage Fund 2021



HB 2127 appropriation; state parks; heritage fund

- Appropriates \$10M from general fund in FY 2021/22 to the State Parks Heritage Fund
