From the Desk of Jim McPherson, President, Arizona Heritage Alliance

Dear AZ Heritage Alliance Members, Partners and Friends,

Reflecting on a Decade of Impact

This year, we mark an important milestone in the Arizona Heritage Alliance's

journey. Over the past decade, we have successfully worked to restore the Arizona State Parks Heritage Fund, a critical resource benefiting communities across Arizona. Thanks to the efforts of thousands of community allies and legislative champions, the fund was reinstated into statute in 2019. Since then, **\$25,782,739** has been allocated to essential projects:

 50% for parks (local, regional, and state)

These funds, along with previous State Parks Heritage Fund projects from 1992 to 2008, have transformed Arizona's outdoor spaces and cultural heritage, leaving a lasting impact on residents and visitors alike. Legislative Challenges and Future Commitment

Despite our successes, 2024 brought setbacks. Senate Concurrent Resolution 1038, which would have secured future funding for the State Parks Heritage Fund, narrowly failed in the State Senate by just one vote. Although this defeat was disappointing, our resolve remains strong. We are actively strategizing for fiscal year 2025 funding and will continue to champion this cause with your support.

Public Support for Outdoor Investment

Encouragingly, a recent statewide survey conducted by Noble Predictive Insights for the Arizona Wildlife Federation highlights overwhelming bipartisan support for outdoor activities and funding initiatives:

- 84% of voters expressed concern about young people not spending enough time outdoors
- 80% support increased funding for state parks
- 80% support protecting the Arizona National Scenic Trail
- 76% back restoring the Arizona State Parks Heritage Fund

Notably, these numbers held steady across diverse demographics, including Hispanic voters and Republican respondents. The survey underscores a shared value: Arizonans want greater investment in nature and outdoor resources, transcending political and cultural boundaries.

Collaborations and Advocacy

Throughout the year, the Arizona Heritage Alliance has worked diligently to strengthen partnerships and advocate for the protection of Arizona's natural, cultural, and historic treasures. Key activities include

River Ranch State Park and the trail named in honor of Janice Miano, our past executive director and board president. Additionally, we applaud the protection of 734 acres in partnership with state and local organizations, paving the way for a new state park in Yavapai County that will preserve critical natural resources and historic sites while expanding recreational opportunities. Meanwhile, the Arizona Game and Fish Department, partnering with wildlife conservation organizations, put a combined total of \$24.2 million into on-theground projects for terrestrial and aquatic wildlife conservation in 2023 (the last full reporting year).

Gratitude and Call to Action

Our progress would not be possible without the steadfast support of elected officials on both sides of the aisle, stakeholders, and friends across Arizona. Yet, challenges lie ahead. The state budget shortfall threatens our gains, and we must work tirelessly to secure funding in the coming fiscal year and advocate for a long-term restoration of the State Park Heritage Fund's original Arizona Lottery financing.
